Helping your child to read at home.

We know that, when children read at home with their parents, their confidence and ability in reading increases. Sometimes parents find it hard to know how to support their children with reading at home.

This week we have sent home special reading target cards with the children's home reader. Each child will have a card which matches their colour book band. On the card, parents will find information about what their child is working on as well as helpful ideas and suggestions about how you can help your child. Any cards that are not returned will not be replaced with another, so please look after them. Your child will keep the same colour card until they have achieved all of their targets in school assessments and move onto another colour or level.
