Dear Parents and carers,

Beginning on Tuesday 13th September and lasting for 10 weeks, our Reception and Year 1 children will take part in "Little Dribbers," an early football and fitness programme. Our Year 6 class will be involved with "Samson Shoes," a design and enterprise project resulting in the class taking their work to the Stadium of Light to pitch















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against other schools for the best design. You may have already seen the flyer for "Family Learning", a 10 week programme which works with families to inspire them to make healthy lifestyle choices. School Dinners

Our breakfast club has always been popular. This year we are placing more staff in the club who will engage the children in a range of activities to get them started for the day ahead. Breakfast club provides a healthy breakfast of toast, cereal, fruit or yoghurt aswell as fun activities, all for £1.















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Class Dojo

This year we will be using Class Dojo even more to communicate with parents. There will be no more paper newsletters given out on a Friday; all of our news will be on Class Dojo's "School Story" feature.

Teacher's now have mini ipads in class and will be using them to take and send instant pictures, either to individual parents or to whole class parent groups to show you the fantastic work the children have been doing at school. It really is a great way of finding out about your child's education and behaviour in school.

Remember you can "like" a photo or comment positively about it. We love to hear your thoughts too.

Class Dojo is still being used for parents to contact teachers with queries or questions or even to let us know about something your child has done well at, at home; you can even send us photos now. Although please remember that teachers have a private life too and may not be able to respond to you immediately and that more lengthy or complicated queries are best discussed with the class teacher in person.

If you have not downloaded the Class Dojo App onto your phone, tablet or computer, you run the risk of missing out on important news and messages. Classes 2, 3 and 4 are sending out new login details but class 6 stay the same. If you have any difficulty with Class Dojo, please see Mr. Orwin or Mr. Soppitt for support. Let's see if we can 100% of parents logged on!

Golden Triangle

As you are aware, our Behaviour Triangle works really well in school and supports children in managing their own behaviour. However, we feel that there are some children in our school, who not only stay in the Green Zone all day every day, but also go that extra mile to demonstrate absolutely outstanding behaviour. So, we have created the Golden Triangle for those children.

Each Friday, the class teachers will choose one child from their class who has demonstrated these qualities over the past week and nominate them to appear on the Golden Triangle in the school hall. The children who have been nominated will have automatic first choice for Golden Time the following week and can sign up first thing on a Monday morning.
