

Remote Learning Information Letter



Dear Parents and carers,

You are receiving this letter because our school has gone into either a partial or full lockdown.

Whilst your child is at home there is an expectation that their education is continued remotely.

We have made clear plans as to what this education will look like but need your support to ensure that your child will not fall behind during this time. Remote learning will now be covering new concepts that will not be repeated once we return to school.

The majority of remote learning will be sent via Class Dojo. This can be accessed on mobile phones, tablets or laptops.

Teachers will post daily videos and tasks for your child to watch and carry out. This will minimise the amount of "teaching" parents have to do.

As parents and carers your role will be:

- to provide a space for your child to work at
- ensure they are in a daily routine to complete the work
- encourage your child to work at the best of their ability
- to provide the correct equipment in order for your child to complete the work given

Each day you should expect from your child's teacher:

- A maths video and task (am)
- A literacy video and task (am)
- A foundation subject video and task (e.g. history, PE, French etc) (pm)
- Regular feedback on your child's portfolio

Each day we expect pupils will:

- Access class dojo every morning and then again in the afternoon
- watch the videos and complete the tasks in the exercise books provided
- Upload a picture of their work onto their Class Dojo or complete the worksheet online
- Complete the work to the best of their ability
- Use the internet safely

Today, your child has brought home two exercise books to record their work in. **These books must be kept and returned as evidence of their progress, when they return to school**. Teachers will provide feedback on Class Dojo, so will not be marking the work when it is returned. Sometimes teachers may post the answers to some questions so that you can mark your child's work with them.

If teachers find that pupils are not posting their work on Class Dojo, they will make a phone call to check to see if they can help in any way to resolve the issue.

Please do not hesitate to message your child's class teacher if issues arise. I thank you in advance for your co-operation in making sure our children continue to learn and grow under the circumstances.
