Breakfast Club

Our breakfast club is completely free and fully funded by Warrens Group PLC and the Greggs Foundation. Children are offered a healthy breakfast of toast, cereal, fruit and yoghurt, followed by a range of activities such as 'Wake Up Shake Up,' playdough, board games and arts and crafts. There is no need to book a place, just turn up as and when you need to.

After-school clubs

We offer a range of after-school clubs every day of the week for all children from reception to Year 6.

Clubs are all completely free, unless ran by an external provider, and are supervised by members of staff. We try to cover a range of interests so there is something for everyone, from ICT and photography, to sports, arts, music and history clubs.



Educational Visits and Visitors

Our school is situated in a area of rich culture and history and so our whole curriculum is designed around some of the local treasures we have on our doorstep. We try to get out of school as much as possible and visit key places such as: Bowes Museum, Shildon Railway Museum, Durham Cathedral, Bishop Auckland Castle and Art Galleries.

We try, as much as possible, to fund school trips but also ask for small donations from parents and carers from time to time.

At our recent, very successful, Ofsted Inspection in October 2019, the report highlighted that St Andrew's pupils feel welcome, safe and included in a school community that cares for them. The governors are fully committed to working with, and providing support, to the teaching staff in achieving these objectives which enables them to provide the best educational and emotional experience for your child.

We are extremely fortunate in having hugely committed staff, who form a strong, caring and forward-thinking team. The school leadership, under Mrs James, ensures that all staff

Our school provides bright, modern accommodation in a beautiful setting. Before the Covid-19 pandemic St Andrew's had already placed a strong focus on outdoor learning. We recently purchased a wide range of outdoor play equipment suitable for all age ranges at the school and governors will continue to support the development of our

Our Safeguarding Commitment

St Andrew's Primary school is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and expects staff and volunteers to share this commitment.

Our recent Ofsted inspection stated that:

"The arrangements for safeguarding are effective. The culture of safeguarding is in line with the caring and supportive ethos of the school. Leaders and staff receive regular training. They apply this knowledge and understanding well and take timely action when required. Leaders always follow up safeguarding issues. They persist with external agencies and families to make sure that pupils who need help get it. "

We believe that children maximise their potential in an environment which is safe, secure and supportive of all their needs, including the needs they have for protection from abuse.

All staff and volunteers adhere to our policy, "Keeping Children safe in School: Child Protection within safeguarding." which can be viewed on our website or on request within school at the admin office in the reception area.

Our School Day

Your child will be greeted at the school gates by a member of staff so that they always start the day with a welcoming smile and a "Good Morning!"

Unless at breakfast club, all children will enter and leave through the main security gate, which opens at 8.45am and is closed at the end of the day at 3.20pm. If children arrive before this time, they are the responsibility of the parents/carer. Children attending breakfast club will use the main school entrance.

At the end of the day, children can be collected from the school yard. There are helpful signs above the classroom doors to direct parents where to stand. We ask that parents are on time to pick up their children, however we know that sometimes parents can run late and so ask you to call the office to let us know that you are on your way.

Children attending after school clubs can collect their child from the main entrance.

If, for any reason, you want to talk to a member of staff, you must not enter the building through classroom doors. Instead, go to the school office and ask to see the member of staff you wish to speak to.

We have an open door policy and welcome parents into school. Appointments to meet with the Headteacher can be made with the school office too.

- 12:15pm -Lunchtime Year 2 to Year 6 children (45 minutes)
- 3:15pm -School closes all children
- 3:15pm Various after school clubs all are free. (45 minutes)

Communicating with parents

We have a number of ways we can communicate with parents. For daily messages we use Class Dojo which is an app parents can download and access photos and messages for their child's class and the whole school. Parents and carers can also leave comments about what they see, as well as send private messages to staff to ask questions about their child.

We also use a text messaging service, where we send links to letters which are uploaded to our website, so parents and carers can access them at any time. Our Facebook page promotes events and links to local initiatives, and our school website has lots of more detailed information about our curriculum and policies.

The Headteacher sends a newsletter to parents and carers once every half term.

We often ask parents and carers to complete surveys about different topics so that they too, can have a voice and let us know how we are doing and what we can do to improve what we offer.

We send a termly assessment report home, which outlines children's progress as well as their behaviour and attitude in school. Parents and carers are also invited to Parents Evenings in the Autumn and Spring Term and then receive an end of year report in the Summer term.

Our Outdoor Facilities

Our playground and school field is a hidden gem, surrounded by leafy bushes and trees giving the feeling that we are in the middle of the countryside. The field is large and is a great space to play on and host Sports days and other events. We also have an outdoor classroom used for Forest School lessons. Here, children can build dens and sit around campfires learning life skills. In addition, we also have a large trim trail for children to climb upon during playtimes.

We have a large allotment around the back of the school, with a garden shed, raised beds and a greenhouse. Here the children grow their own vegetables and fruit which can be later used in the school kitchen for school dinners or in cookery club.

Our Nursery, Reception and Year 1 classrooms all have direct access to their own outdoor areas straight from their classrooms. The children use these areas during the day to play, explore and learn.

Our School Facilities

Our school, hall is the hub of the school and hosts all events, assemblies, PE lessons, breakfast and after-school clubs and dinner times. We have a range of high quality PE apparatus to be used in this space and a stage to be used for performances.

In school we have a range of ICT resources from laptops and classroom computers, to ipads, tablets and kindles. These can be used throughout the day in lessons and during some after-school clubs. Every classroom has a large, interactive smart screen.

> From the hall, there is also access to our extensive library, "The Woodland of Knowledge" as well as a range of home reading books for all abilities.





School Meals

Our school meals are freshly cooked in our school kitchen . We offer a healthy, nutritious, two course school meal for \pounds 2.10 a day. School meals are free for all reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children and to those eligible and meet benefits criteria.

Children have a three week menu to choose from three options: meat, vegetarian or sandwich/jacket potato. We can accommodate for vegetarian, food allergies and halal and our cook is very good with those "picky eaters" and tries to accommodate wherever she can.

We actively encourage parents to choose school dinners. Being a parent is busy enough without making a packed lunch every day, it is financially a good option and you know your child is getting a hearty meal everyday.

Parents who choose a packed lunch option must ensure their child has a balanced healthy dinner. We do not allow chocolate bars, fizzy/sugary drinks or sweets and ask you not to include them. Any items such as this will be put to one side and a healthy alternative will be provided.

As we are a cashless school, once your child reaches Year 3, we ask that parents pay for school dinners via our Parentpay online facility.

Snacks

We are part of the Fresh Fruit to schools scheme and all Early Years and KS1 children are given fresh fruit every day at snack time. All children under 5 are eligible for Free School Milk, however we provide free milk to all reception children, even when they are 5. This is funded by The Warrens Group PLC who sponsor our free breakfast club too. Children in KS1 can opt to pay for milk via the Cool Milk scheme.

We know that hydrated children are the best learners and so we provide drinks bottles to every child in school. These are washed daily and refilled every morning for children to access throughout the day.

Our Curriculum

Our Curriculum is designed around three key drivers, which were voted for by staff, governors and parents.

They are:

- Aspirations and Possibilities
- Wellbeing
- Knowledge

We have planned a progressive curriculum which ensures we promote these key drivers. We teach our subjects as discreet subjects so that children learn to become, for example: historians, scientists, geologist, mathematicians etc. We cover all subjects within the National Curriculum requirements.

In Literacy, we teach using quality texts as stimuli for reading and writing lessons and use the Read Write Inc scheme for teaching phonics and early reading. In maths, we teach using a maths mastery approach.

Teachers use a range of teaching styles such as: individual, group and whole class sessions. They plan outdoor lessons and use ICT to engage children in learning

Assessment

Assessments are used throughout the school year to help teachers find out where each

child's abilities lie in all subjects. If gaps in learning are identified, teachers can plan to accommodate this and enable children to catch up.

The Department for Education assesses children in variety of ways and schools have to report these tests. Your child will take the following assessments:

Reception - Early Learning Goals (assessed using observations)

Year 1- Phonics screening test

Year 2- End of Key stage 1 tests in Maths and English

Year 4 - Multiplication Test online timetables test



Year 6 - End of Key Stage 2 test in Maths, Reading and Spelling and Grammar

Parents and carers are kept well informed about how they can support their child with these tests.

School Uniform

As part of our core values, we encourage children to take pride in their appearance and wearing a uniform is part of this. We ask that parents try hard to comply with our uniform policy so that there is consistency across the school.

Our uniform consists of the Magic 5:

- 1. Royal blue jumper or cardigan
- 2. Grey or black shorts, trousers, dress or skirt
- 3. White polo shirt or shirt
- 4. Black, grey or white socks or tights
- 5. All black shoes





Gingham dresses can be worn in the summer and all black trainers are acceptable as long as they do not have coloured branding, soles or laces. We ask that hair accessories match the school uniform colours.

For PE we ask that children wear:

- Black shorts, leggings or tracksuit bottoms
- Yellow t-shirt
- Black jumper or hoody

For swimming lessons, we ask that children wear plain black swimsuits or swimming trunks with a swimming hat.

Behaviour and Attitudes

Our school prides itself on excellent behaviour and expects high standards at all times. We promote positive choices in all aspects of school life. If children make poor choices, they are guided to reflect on their choices and helped to understand how to make better choices next time.

We have three rules in our school:

Everyone has the right to:

- Be safe
- Learn
- Be respected

• Be respected Ofsted (2019) said," Leaders and staff expect all pupils to behave well. Pupils behave very well in lessons and around the school."

We have 11 "Core Values" which we teach, promote and recognise. These are: confidence, pride, determination, resilience, teamwork, integrity, politeness, respect, responsibility, compassion and honesty. Children can receive Dojo points when they demonstrate any of these core values and when they reach a certain goal, they are presented with bronze, silver and gold pins to wear with pride.

<u>Homework</u>

We know that family life can be busy at times and so we ask parents and carers to plan their own homework schedule. We give you the tools to practise basic skills like handwriting, spellings, phonics and timetables, using some online programmes and posting tasks on Class Dojo, where pupils can upload their work to their private portfolio pages.

There is an expectation that parents read with their child at least 3 times a week or more and log their reading in a reading record book, which is checked by the class teacher.

Children with Special Educational Needs

Year on year, we are finding that parents and carers of children with SEN are choosing St Andrew's Primary school for their child.

We have a SEND policy on our website, which gives details of the process we take to identify special needs and how we support a child in making progress within their area of need.

We work with a range of outside agencies to offer additional support to SEND children, such as: speech and language, CAMHs and the ASD team. Our staff are trained to write quality support plans that set targets for each individual child in order for them to reach their full potential. The school SENDco oversees all SEND pupils and quality assures all documents SEND with and leads meetings pupils with EHCP's. If your child does have a special education need or disability, and you have some questions about how your child would access learning in a mainstream school, please call the Headteacher to discuss your concerns; we are an inclusive school and welcome all children to join us.

Community Links

<u>St Andrew's PTA</u>

We have a PTA, who work with staff members to fundraise for our school. We welcome any parents to come along and help out with events and raise much needed money for school funds.

St Andrew's Church

We have close links with our local church and vicar. Rev. Kedilty often comes to school to deliver assemblies and speak with the children and classes visit the church to learn about Christianity. We also hold annual Harvest festivals, Easter and Christmas services which are all very well attended.

Family Events

Throughout the year, we hold a range of events for families to join in. Our Christmas shows are particularly well attended, along with our music and dance whole school assemblies too. We hold book clubs, Dad's events and Christmas and Summer fayres.

Local Emergency Services

We have very close links with our local PCSOs who work with the school to teach children about being good citizens in the community. We also visit the local Fire Station to learn about their roles and how to stay safe in the event of a fire and river safety. Our Year 6 classes take part in the Safety Carousel, where they meet lifeguards, police, firefighters, paramedics etc.



St Andrew's Primary School has a small Nursery class with its own classroom and outdoor area. We admit rising threes at the start of the term that the child turns three-year-old in. Children can come for their 15 hours entitlement or for free 30 hours, if eligible. Parents and carers who are not eligible may pay for additional child care on an afternoon.

The Reception class also has its own classroom and outdoor space, which includes a huge mud kitchen, climbing frame and sandpit. Both Early Years classes learn, "in the moment," this means that the highly trained staff follow the children's interests and plan around these, ensuring all children are engaged in their learning.

<u>Attendance</u>

We know that with good attendance comes good progress and so we encourage children and parents to have a positive attitude towards attendance from a very young age.

Our Learning Mentor leads on attendance and works with parents who may be struggling with getting their child to school. There are lots of strategies we can use to support families in avoiding persistent absenteeism or punctuality issues.

The Government condones family holidays taken in term time, however the headteacher may authorise a holiday in exceptional circumstances. Parents and carers must apply for holidays in term time in advance.

Support for Families

At St. Andrew's, we aren't just here for the child; we're here for the whole family. We can support families in a number of ways :

- Financial support with access to grants and food banks
- Early Help for families
- Referrals to CAMHs for child mental health
- Access to a range of Voluntary Services
- In school support with attendance or behavior at home
